

Comments submitted at the Pavilion and Beacon Hill Fellowship Hall Public Meetings

They are in no particular order:

- a) Misguided conservation objectives on the Heath (Western Corridor) - P
- b) Oppose planning permission for Car Wash at Spencers' Garage as will back onto recreation ground therefore, fumes, noise, polluted spray potential on football field, recreation ground and children's playground. No pollution of ground in ANOB. - BH
- c) Absolutely no infill to protect the "feel" of a village and are of (?unreadable) we moved here. - P
- d) Sport Facilities. Football Pitches all ages. Martlesham lags well behind Kesgrave. BH
- e) There needs to be trees planted throughout the development (Astral?) plus open spaces, services, Dr (Doctors?) school, shops etc to be in place before development is finished - BH
- f) Major Improvements to A12 – required before more new development approved. Traffic Lights at roundabouts not the answer. Tail Backs already happen South of Black Tiles roundabout. - BH
- g) 1/ Need better cycle ways along main roads 2/ Look at bottleneck at roundabout A12/Main Road coming from Woodbridge, increased volume will create big tail backs at peak times. - BH
- h) Solar Panels on Roofs unsightly and dupious long term benefit. Panels need but of renewable resources to make. (Change to "Non-renewable seems to be in different hand?) _ P
- i) Encourage use of Biomass – either for single or new group development. Encourage more sustainable development. Enforce "greater" regulation for businesses in the ANOB's.- HB
- j) Encourage improved Water Management, including rainwater harvesting, in any new development. - HB
- k) 1/ How will the Main Road in Martlesham be changed to accommodate the increased volume of traffic. 2/ Will there be more dedicated cycle paths. - HB
- l) I am very concerned that the environment of the green areas on Martlesham Heath would be spoilt by Tarmac cycle paths. Wooded areas, such as the area between the Green and Eagle Way and Heathland on the Western Corridor are precious amenities and I should be seriously alarmed if they were disrupted by metalled cycle paths. It is really important to maintain these areas. - P
- m) NO cycleway through the woods if the BT development gets going. - P

Other Sticky Notes which have no detail on when or where posted.

1/ We need to reserve land for a graveyard. St Mary's extension is filling fast.

2/ Please keep the SSSI protected, as it's a nice place for a walk and a place to "feel" history. And I guess many children like the area and especially the runway.

3/Need more Community owned or managed open areas particularly away from Martlesham Heath.

4/ Protect open spaces in Martlesham Heath

5/ Do NOT have higher density housing – Dedicated gardens and open spaces are (? unreadable) to improve living condition and generally (? Unreadable) High Density housing can lead to more neighbourly tension.

6/ More accessible "country" areas needed close by e.g. Dr Brittain's Wood

7/ No gravel surfaces – dangerous for cyclists when falling off and ice up in bad weather and gravel spreads.

8/ Environmental: No wind turbines – use solar panels. Residential housing – tree lined. Within Flats/ Blocks use collective recycling and ONE satellite dish for the block – so it looks more attractive.
